One of the most extensive photographic records covering 138 selected historic covered bridges found in North America, the book offers details truss diagrams, basic construction details, and location information for each featured bridge. A complete index of all of the nearly 1,000 surviving covered bridges is included, and a number of bridges are presented in multipage formats.

.com You don't have to be a fan of Robert James Waller to admire the covered bridges of the American Midwest. You'll learn from this heavily illustrated book how important those bridges were to rural communities; quite apart from spanning streams of water, they served as gathering places, even makeshift town halls and wedding parlors.

You'll also learn that many of them are all but doomed to disappear in the face of "progress." The bridges were not originally confined to the Midwest, but many in the East are already gone; only one, for instance, survives in New Jersey. This book makes a quiet but powerful case for preserving those that remain. If you're a fan of Eric Sloane's books of rural Americana, you're sure to enjoy this excursion into the countryside.
