This booklet, first printed in 1971, was prepared for the National Science Foundation by Charles Neider, who worked in the Antarctic while collecting material for his book *Edge of the World: Ross Island, Antarctica* (New York, Doubleday, 1974, 461p.). It has been updated by the Office of Polar Programs (Revised 1989). Ross Island is a volcanic island in the Ross Sea by Antarctica, on the coast of Victoria Land. Sir James Clark Ross discovered it in 1841, and the island was later named in honor of him by Robert F. Scott. The volcanoes Terror (3230 m) and Erebus (4023 m) are situated on the island. They were named by Ross after his ships HMS Erebus and HMS Terror .
