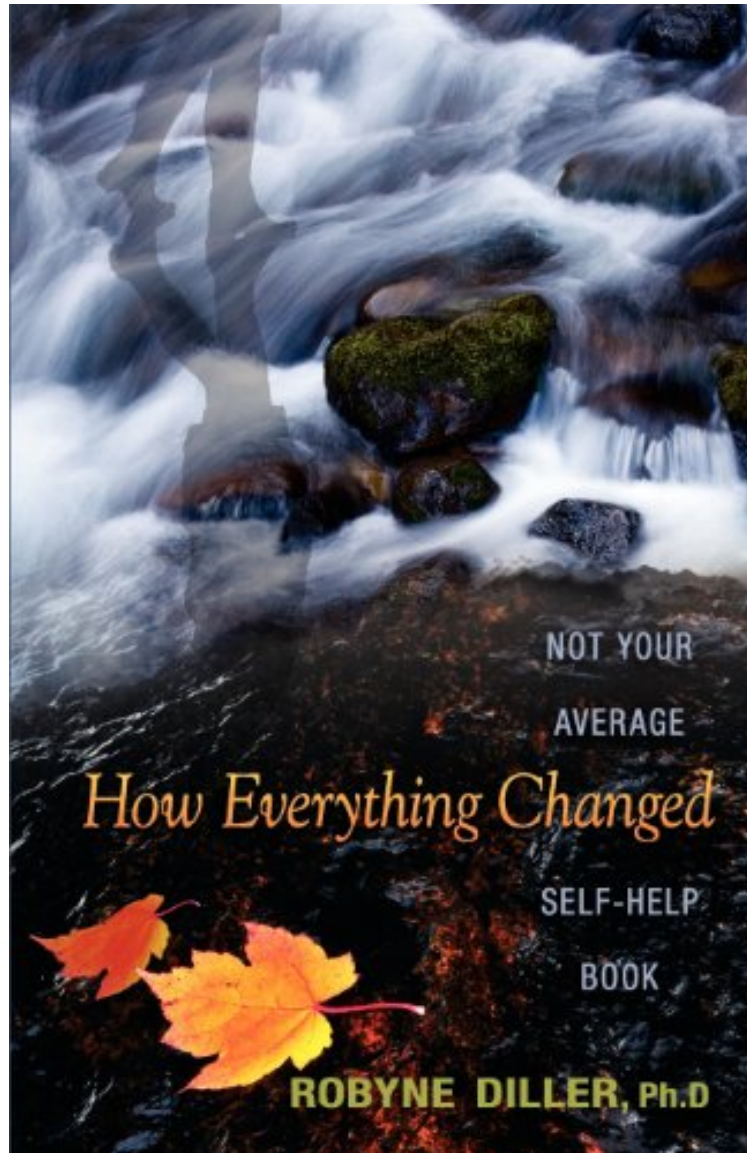

I am Robyne's youngest sister, the "free spirit," in the book. I always knew my sister was a good writer, but following her journey towards making Aliyah and learning about her struggle to find where she belonged was quite revealing to me. I don't expect to learn such intimate details of a family member in terms of their thought processes and the physical toll it takes, but I picked up on it pretty quickly within the first few chapters. Moving to the UK was very hard, much harder than I expected, yet it was the best thing I could have done. I do think that learning another language (Robyne learned Hebrew ... UK is the English language, not American) and knowing that everything doesn't surround my city or my country is a good thing ... or at least a good thing for me.
