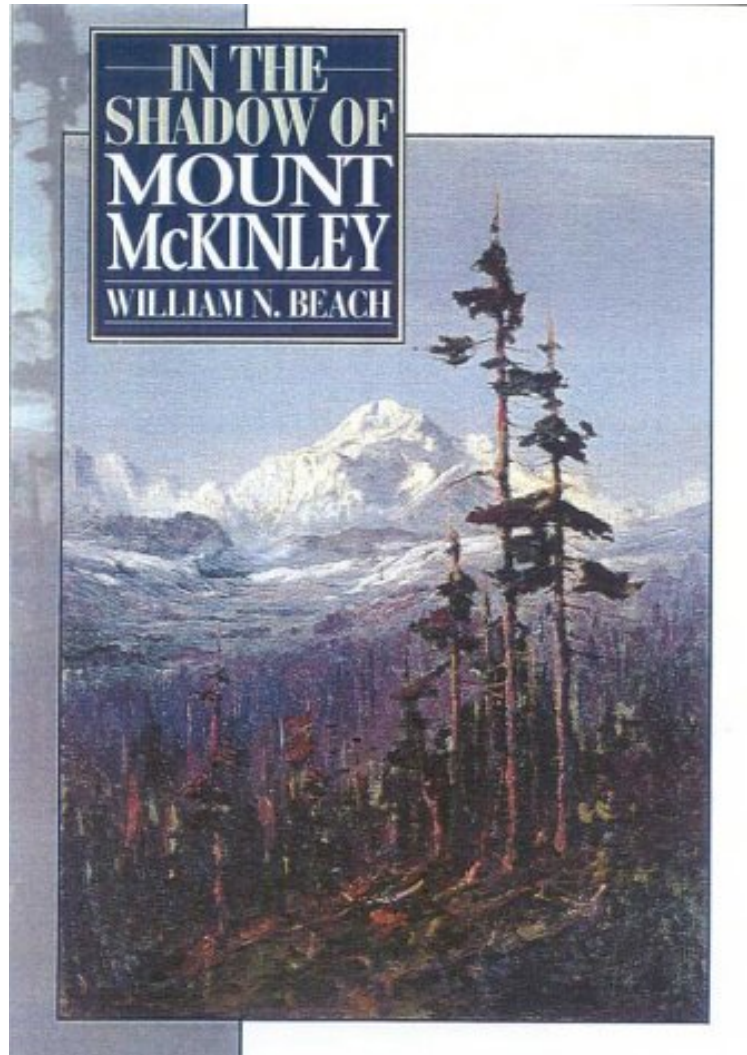

The book describes the sizes of the animals seen, missed, and killed; the rugged difficulties of traversing the scenic region (more than one trip), the weather, food, and some characters. The hunter/adventurer packed-in an early moving camera, which was heavy, but no zoom feature had been invented yet. Apparently he shot some trophy animals for the Museum of Natural History. Nowadays, a hunter interested in the size of the trophies caught might well give this book the full five stars. Some of the hunter/author's attitudes are inappropriate today, but

The author relates his exploring and hunting expeditions into the regions near Mount McKinley during the decade of the 1920s. This book will appeal most to those with a specific interest in the history and early exploration of the Mount McKinley region.
