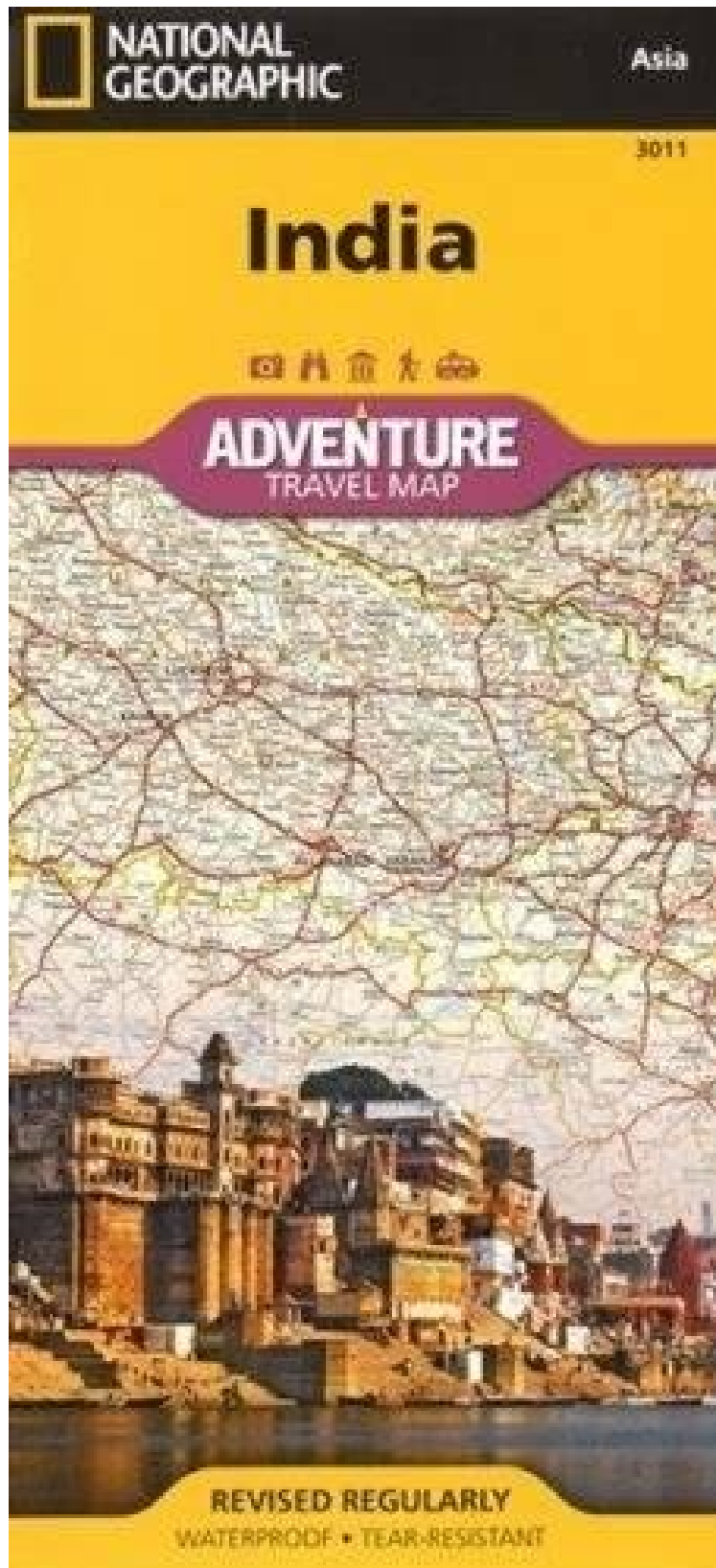

Although I'm a long time member of the National Geographic Society, this is the first time I've bought an NGS map.
