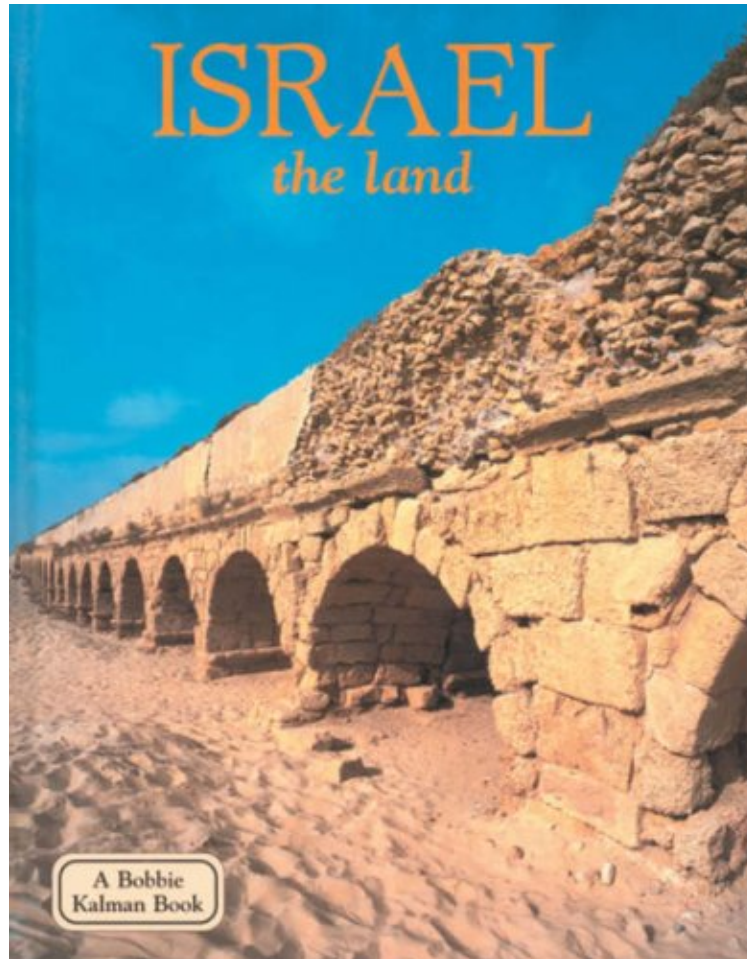

Eight gates lead into this part of Jerusalem which is divided into four quarters: Jewish, Muslim, Christian, and Armenian. The old city's narrow, twisty roads are packed with small homes, markets, and shops. All the buildings are made of a rose-gold stone, called Jerusalem stone, that makes the city glow at night. Many of Jerusalem's most sacred sites are in the Old City. Outside the wallsOutside the City Wall is a vibrant modern city. The first neighborhoods were built outside the walls over 100 years ago. Today the area includes office buildings, stores, restaurants, museums, and Israel's parliament, the Knesset.
