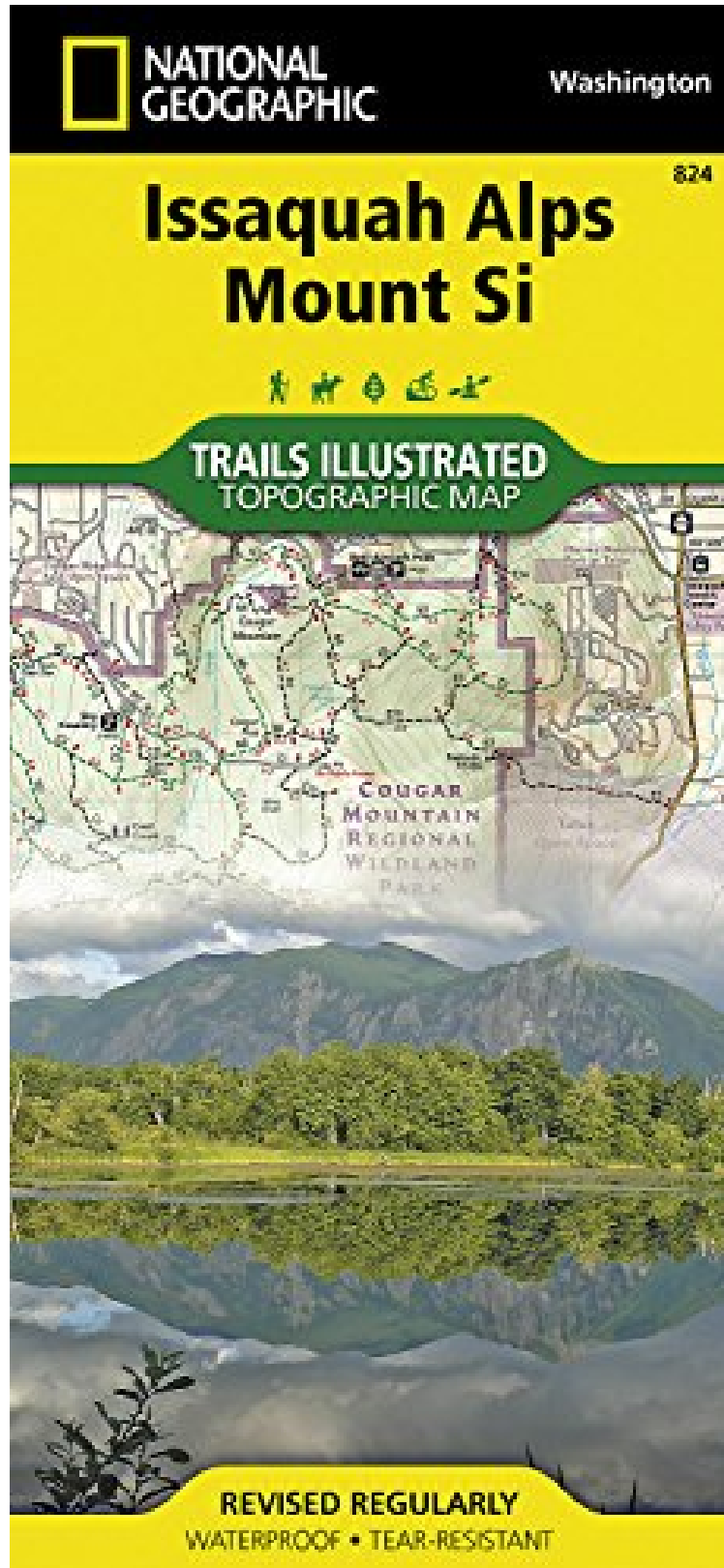

This is another excellent map from National Geographic / Trails Illustrated, and meets the high bar that these maps have set over the past couple of decades. This map arrived in perfect condition. I live in this area, so I have looked it over for precision. This map is copyrighted 2016; the only flaw I discovered is that it marks a hospital that was closed in 2008. This map covers a significant number of suburban neighborhoods, and shows those roads very accurately, including privately owned roadways. However, due to the scale, this map only labels the major roads through these neighborhoods, and does not label all the very small neighborhood roads. It represents the topography well, and the trails through the numerous parks are labeled well. There is a good chart of the trails in each of the nine parks in this map. This is an excellent map for planning and exploring the area. However, at 1:30,000, the scale is a bit high-level for small details of some of the parks. However, for those smaller details, it's hard to beat the local specific trail maps available at the parks. I heartily recommend this map!

National Geographic's Trails Illustrated map of the Issaquah Alps and Mount Si provides unparalleled detail for outdoor enthusiasts seeking to explore the endless recreational opportunities in this area just east of Puget Sound. Expertly researched and created in partnership with King County, Washington DNR and others, the map covers tens of national, state and regional recreation areas. Coverage includes Mount Si and West Tiger Mountain Natural Resources Conservation Areas, Lake Sammamish and Squak Mountain State Parks, Tiger Mountain and Raging River State Forests, Cougar Mountain Regional Wildland Park and Taylor Mountain Forest as well as the cities of Bellevue, Newcastle, Renton, Sammamish, Snoqualmie and North Bend. Trails appear on the map with mileage markers between intersections, including King County Regional Trails, which are highlighted. An inset profiles the Tiger Mountain Trail, with elevation, distance and key points of interest. To aid in your navigation, the map base also includes contour lines, elevations, labeled peaks, water features and clear color-coded boundaries between different land management areas. Recreation features are clearly marked as well, including interpretive trails, campgrounds, picnic areas and shelters, boat launches, fishing, swimming and rock climbing areas, waterfalls and scenic viewpoints. Every Trails Illustrated map is printed on "Backcountry Tough" waterproof, tear-resistant paper. A full UTM grid is printed on the map to aid with GPS navigation. Other features found on this map include: Issaquah, Lake Sammamish, Lake Youngs, Newcastle, Snoqualmie Falls, Snoqualmie National Forest. Map Scale = 1:30,000 Sheet Size = 25.5" x 37.75" Folded Size = 4.25" x 9.25"
