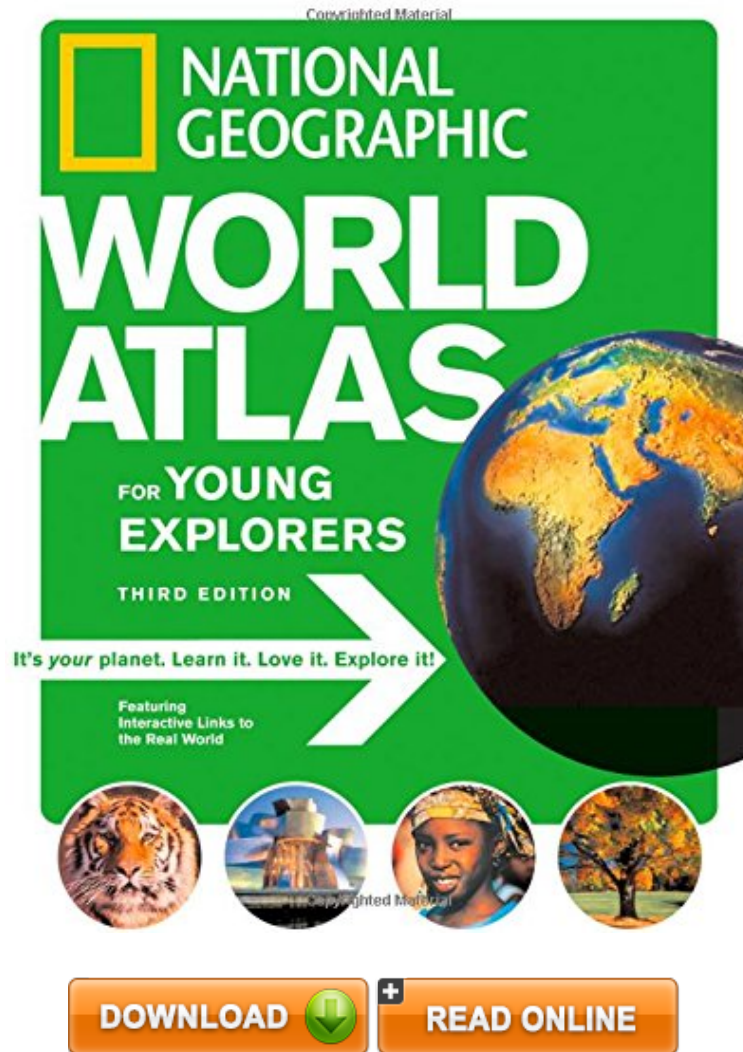

Excellent atlas for elementary and middle grade students By Z Hayes I have been looking for a good atlas to use with my 5-year-old daughter and of all the ones I've browsed through, this seems the best. There is a how-to guide at the beginning of the book which provides useful guidelines on how to maximize use of this atlas, and the bonus is that this atlas is also interactive - there's yellow-and-black icons on most pages which lead to a website that allows children to explore the world (there are videos, music, and games). This site also provides more in-depth information which can be very useful for school projects, and there are maps which can be downloaded and colored. All in all, the interactive features are excellent and highly engaging! The atlas itself covers the continents, i.e. North America; South America; Europe; Asia; Africa; Australia, New Zealand, and

Oceania; and, Antarctica. The oversized feature of this book allows for easy perusal (without having to strain one's eyes) of the maps. The maps themselves are appropriately detailed, with physical and political maps represented alongside each other for convenient reference. There are also maps of natural disasters, world religions, the solar system, the ocean floors, population, etc. The back of the book contains an index for easy reference. Maps are nice, descriptions are not at the right levelBy Rafaell had hoped this book would have more information about individual countries to satisfy my 5-yo daughter's growing curiosity about the world. On each fold-out pair of pages one finds a map of a region (e.g., northern Africa, central South America) containing several countries, with little symbols showing information about major industries. Also included is a main text paragraph or two and a few photos with captions that each might say one thing about one country. I find that the language level and construction is perhaps understandable but not engaging for a child to read or be read to. We can easily see the big picture of each region, along with an abundance of geographic features (rivers, mountain ranges, deserts, plateaus, etc.). I was able to do a side-by-side comparison of several large atlases, and the National Geographic ones by far had the best layout and color schemes to help the reader find the information he's looking for.So far, we've used this atlas for ages 10 through 14.

There is also a good explanation of the types of maps and how to read a map. The section for each continent starts with a physical and a political map; sandwiched between are four pages of color photos. Regions or countries are divided into 32 separate maps that show20 political and physical features plus icons for crops, industries, and other aspects of the economy. Maps are generally large and very easy to read, although in some casesWestern Europe, for examplecountries are crowded onto a single map, and some information is lost in the gutter. Each map is accompanied by flagsand facts about each countrys area, population, capital, and chief language. The U.S. maps come with similar information for the states.
