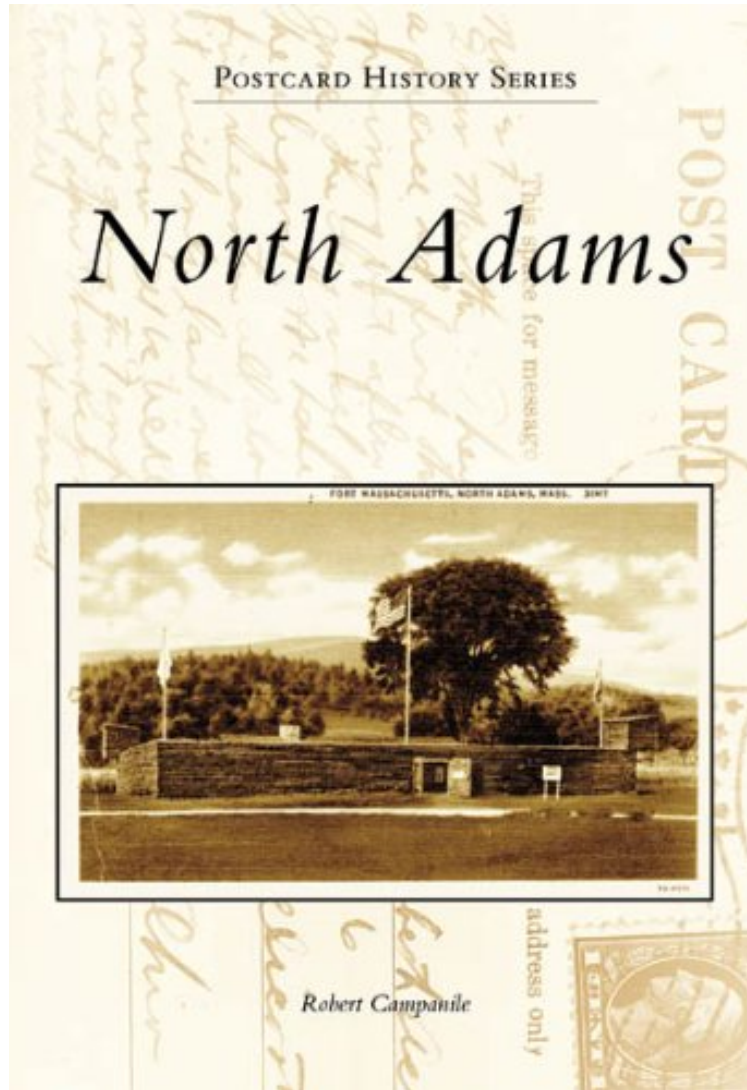

history. The captions that accompany each picture are well done and informative. Like most of the "Images of America" series, this book will have a limited appeal to mostly local residents or former residents. But if you can count yourself in those groups, I can highly recommend this compendium.

North Adams is nestled in a comfortable valley in the northern Berkshire Mountains. It exhibits a rich diversity of character, mirrored by its textured and varied environment. The city's history goes back to the 1700s, with a military encounter during the French and Indian War that set the tone for future challenges. Through vintage postcards, North Adams reflects the unique history of this city. The postcards represent what is essentially a highlight tour of North Adams, a journey through its first golden era from its incorporation as a city in 1895 to the 1940s. Whether native, newcomer, or tourist, these postcards serve up a taste of North Adams that is both nostalgic and golden."

About the Author Robert Campanile was the first director and original designer of the North Adams Museum of History and Science of the North Adams Historical Society. He also designed the Vermont Covered Bridge Museum in Bennington, Vermont. Prior to relocating to the northern Berkshires, he spent over nine years at the American Museum of Natural History in New York City. He presently directs the Center for Science and Cultural Literacy.
