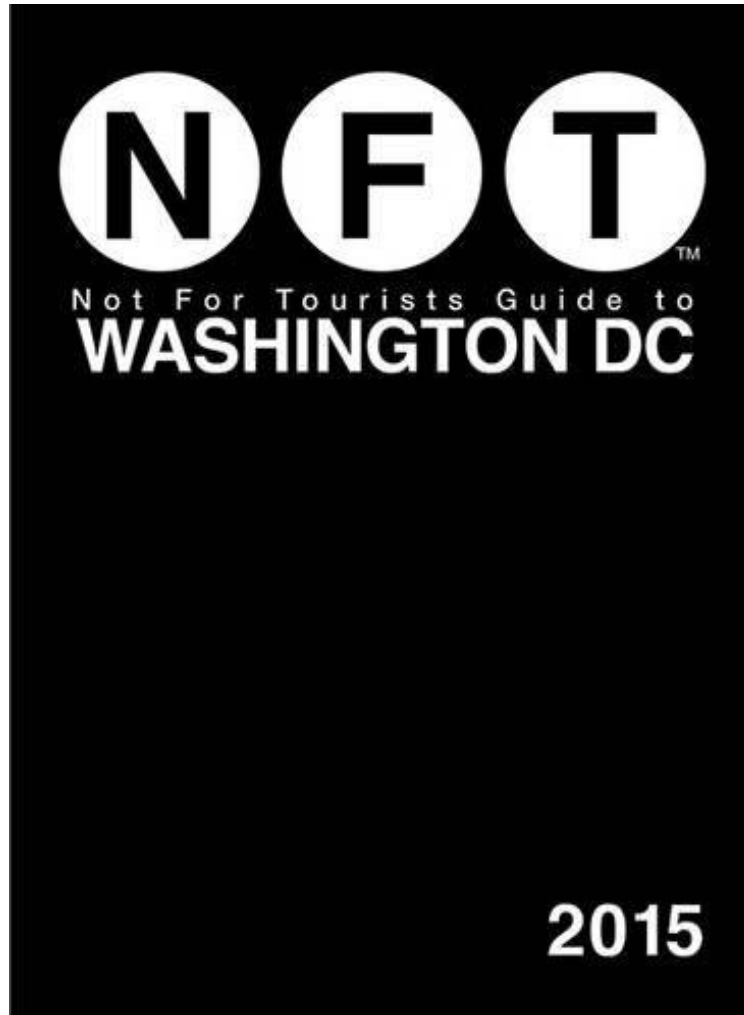

We all have smartphones so lots of maps in guidebooks are almost unnecessary. 25% of this book is maps. 2. In order to maintain the same format on each page, there is LOTS of whitespace. One of my favorite things about guidebooks is how concise and space-saving they are--cramming lots of information into one book. Not only are there many pages that are less than half full, the font for the top paragraph (the interesting description of the neighborhoods) is laughably small, and the font for the rest of the book is not much bigger. I am not old nor do I need glasses, but reading this book is not enjoyable. If this book is for locals, it doesn't need to be tiny. We aren't carrying it in our backpacks across the country. 3. Many of the little 'blurbs' about the restaurants and destinations listed are

ambiguous. 'Oily' shouldn't be used to describe apparently delicious food. I was more often confused by the recommendation than confident that it was a place I should visit. Target is 'Wal-mart in drag.' Under a listing for Nightlife in Falls Church, it says, 'Why are you in Falls Church? (A good bar, nonetheless).' I really love guidebooks, and I was excited to learn about some 'off-the-beaten' path places here in my new city.
