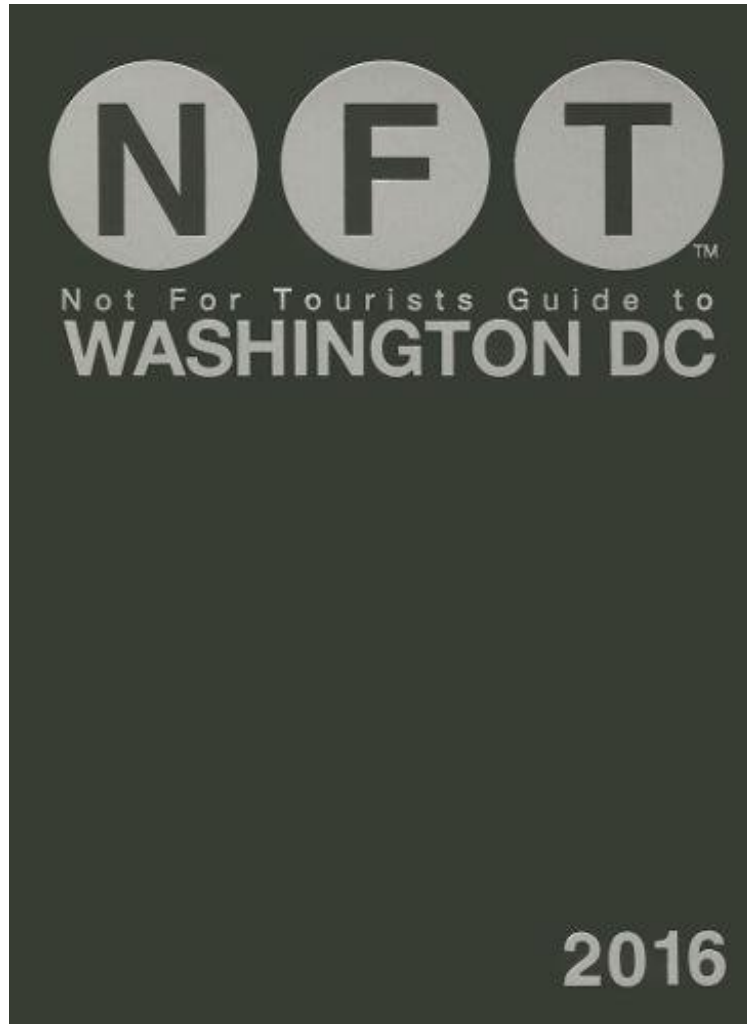

If I can't trust the book to be accurate on facts that I do know, then how can I trust it for other information? A few examples from the 2016 guidebook: The book states that MARC trains don't run on weekends, even though they have since at least 2014. Metro fares are outdated. The book states a minimum of \$1.70, but the minimum is \$1.75 Repeated references to Rhino Bar, even though it closed in February, 2015. It still lists the Burberry store on Connecticut Avenue, even though this store has been closed since 2014. Numerous map errors in how roads connect (including the street I live on). No book will be completely accurate, but a guidebook shouldn't be

years out of date the day it's published. 5 of 5 people found the following review helpful. So out of date- you'll be better off with no guide than with this one. By 7saturdays I borrowed this book from the library- thank goodness I didn't spend money on it! It says 2016, but actually it seems they just took a guide book from 5-8 years ago, typed 2016 on the cover and released it. It is so out-of-date I can't imagine how it can be useful to anyone. It doesn't even show the silver line of the metro- it is missing an entire metro line!!!
