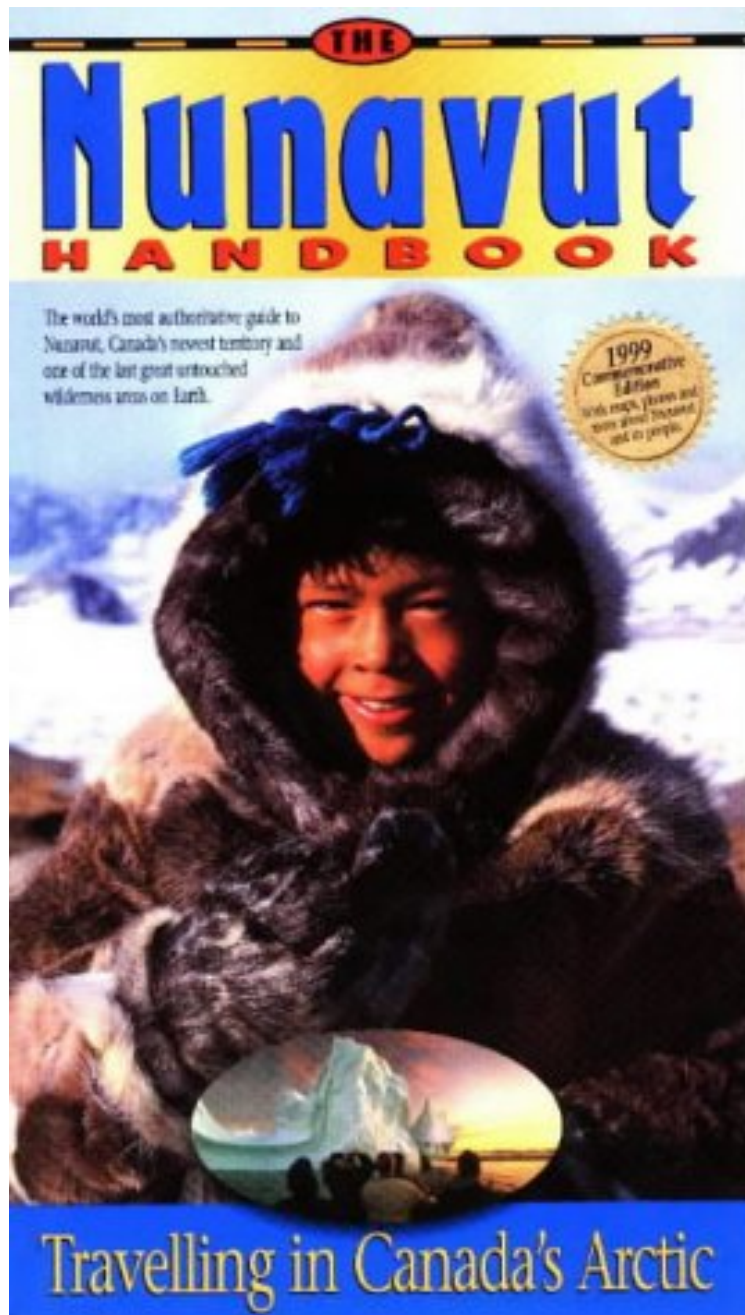

Believe me there isn't much there either. Nunavut is a new Native Province in Canada. Its some of the most beautiful, unspoiled land you will ever see. During my hunt I got my caribou, saw two polar bears, and one Barrens Ground Grizzly, snowshoe hares, geese etc. We found an old camp site (prior to 1850) looking around we found bone needles and small broken implements. During rest stops, or scoping for our prey, we would find dwarf blueberries that were delicious. All of these things are what have should have been in the book.
