There seems to be an error on every page, from little things like typos to major things like geographic black holes.For instance, with the Adena Trail, the first ride/map, there are two different spellings for Chillicothe (the map reads Chilucothe); granted, that's a copy-edit snafu. But in the parking directions section, it lists four possibilities; unfortunately the first three are located over 200 miles away, and the fourth site is over 70 miles away. Better get your ride on!Flip forward a few pages to Beaver Creek State Park in East Liverpool, OH...which is referenced in the Cleveland area. Uh-oh - there are over a hundred miles between the two cities. It'd be quicker to go to Pennsylvania, which is only a few miles west of the trail, but if you thought you could go to a Browns game after the ride, realize you'll be in Steeler country.One hates to quibble as it takes a lot of work to write and publish a book...but one also hates to drive around lost. There is more faith invested in a guidebook as a reader, you got to trust that the author and publisher did their respective homework. After two or three bad set of directions, only the most adventurous of riders would take off in search of one of these trails without checking other maps and online sites beforehand.So if there's a silver lining, this brightly colored little volume does give a nice overview to the variety of bike trails in the Buckeye State. But it may be a bit like playing Marco Polo in the pool to get there: holler loud, pack extra food, and make sure the cell phone is charged.
