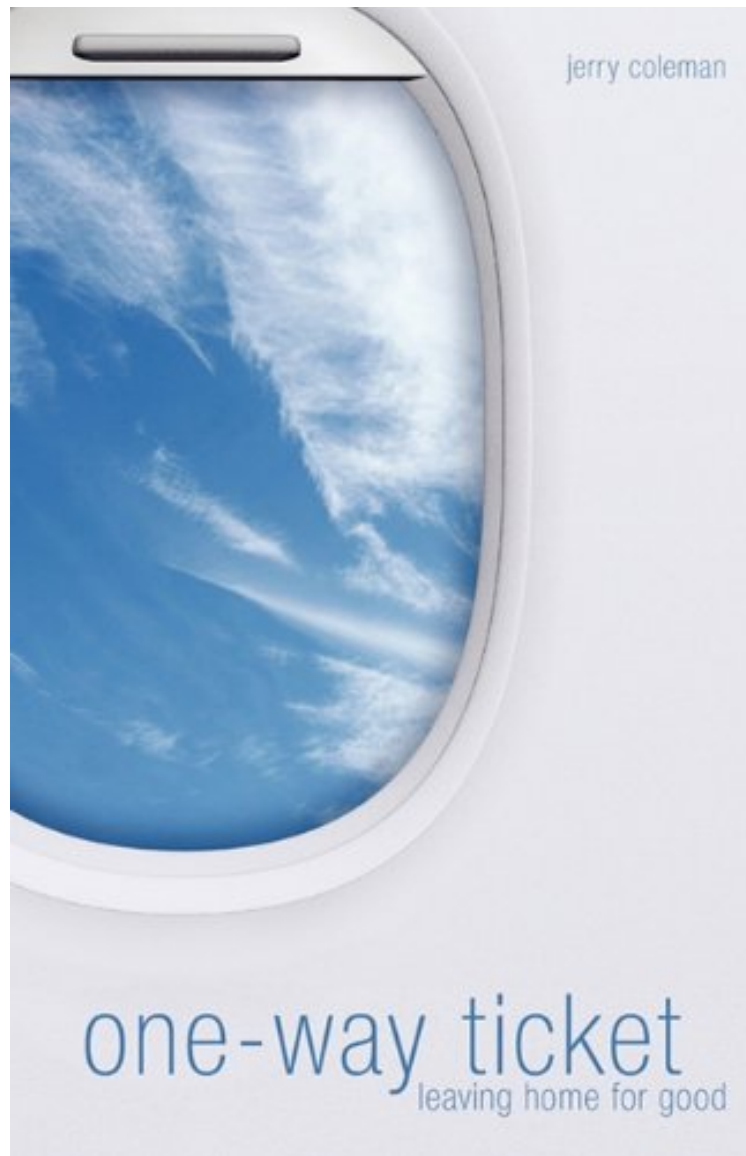

It costs less than \$20. It is not published by a well known author. I had to hunt the book up by both the title and author's name. All in all, it could be missed by too many people. That is a shame. I wanted this book because I already knew some of the story of Jerry Coleman. His family left the United States in 1996 to become a missionary in Europe. When he arrived in Europe he could not speak the language of the nation where he lived and only one small church of his denomination existed anywhere on the main continent. 15 years later (2011) when he returned to the United States for a visit, there were 20 churches of his denomination planted in several countries! He went into a technologically advanced area, that was less Christian than the United States, and saw amazing church growth of a type longed for within the United States. Jerry is a gifted teacher, leader, administrator. What I like best about this book is that none of that comes through. Perhaps we can learn that portion of the story in a future book. When you read the pages of this book, you will be reading the words of a father and a contemplative. You see the world through his eyes. The book is written in a series of small sketches that seam together, much like reading a personal journal. Each sketch has enough fodder for a devotional reading. It can easily be read in one sitting, but might work better if read just a sketch at a time. Do not miss this book.

On August 13, 1996, Jerry Coleman and his family left the suburbs on a One-Way Ticket to Budapest, Hungary in Europe. As a family, they learned the Hungarian language, connected with people in their community and tried to resist the desire to pack it up and go back to a more comfortable life (read Let's Go Sell Insurance). One-Way Ticket helps address the questions: "What would it be like to live in another country?" "What would it be like to take my family on a One-Way Ticket?" "What would it be like to send a loved one far away from home?" "What would it be like to leave home for good?"
