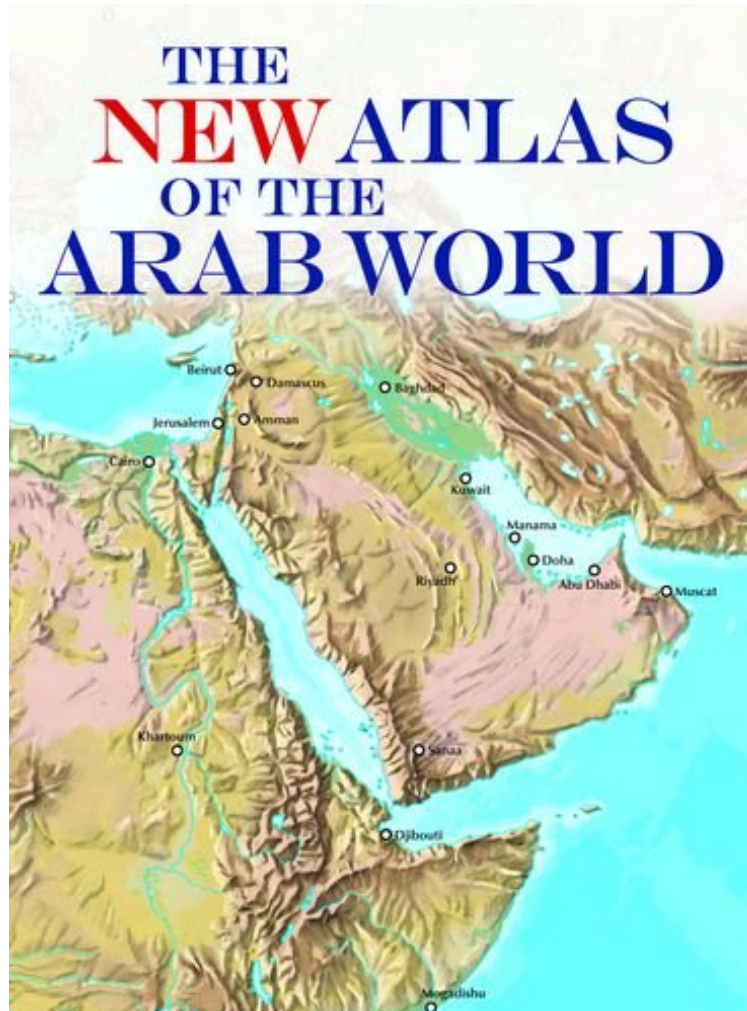

By Biblio-Nut Like many publications titled ATLAS, this book is high on photographs and narratives but low on cartography. Of the 144 pages only 28 are devoted to full page maps. Also, these maps are regional, covering more than one country. The atlas is concerned only with members of the Arab League. Each country description has a small map varying in size from 2 to 6 inches per side. The country descriptions cover several pages of historical, social and cultural information, as well as photographs of historical political figures, sites and everyday scenes. The photos, as well as the few satellite images add very little to the value of the atlas. Physically, the book is attractive with glossy

pages sewn in signatures and what appears to be a full cloth hardcover binding. Although published by the American University Press in Cairo, the atlas was created and copyrighted in Germany. The only competition is the National Geographic Atlas of the Middle East, which is much richer in cartography: each covered country has a detailed 1 to 2 page map..0 of 0 people found the following review helpful.
