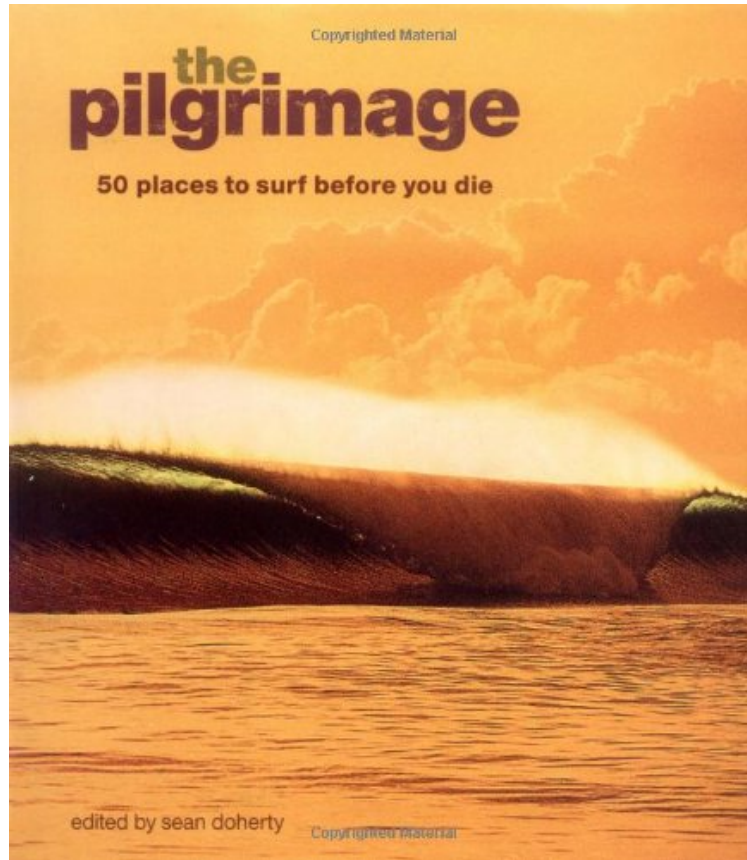

Lots of out of date info and could use more detail on the breaks. For example, the book still says that you have to be a guest on Tavarua to surf Cloudbreak and Restaurants, but that hasn't been true for several years now. I have surfed both while staying on Namotu and the Fijian laws have changed to open the breaks in general. Another example is no mention of localism at places like Pipe or Honolua Bay. That information is pretty critical, you're not just going to book a flight to the north shore and get whatever wave you want. Otherwise a decent book for inspiration, just don't expect it to be an updated source guide for travel to these locations.0 of 0 people found the following review helpful.
