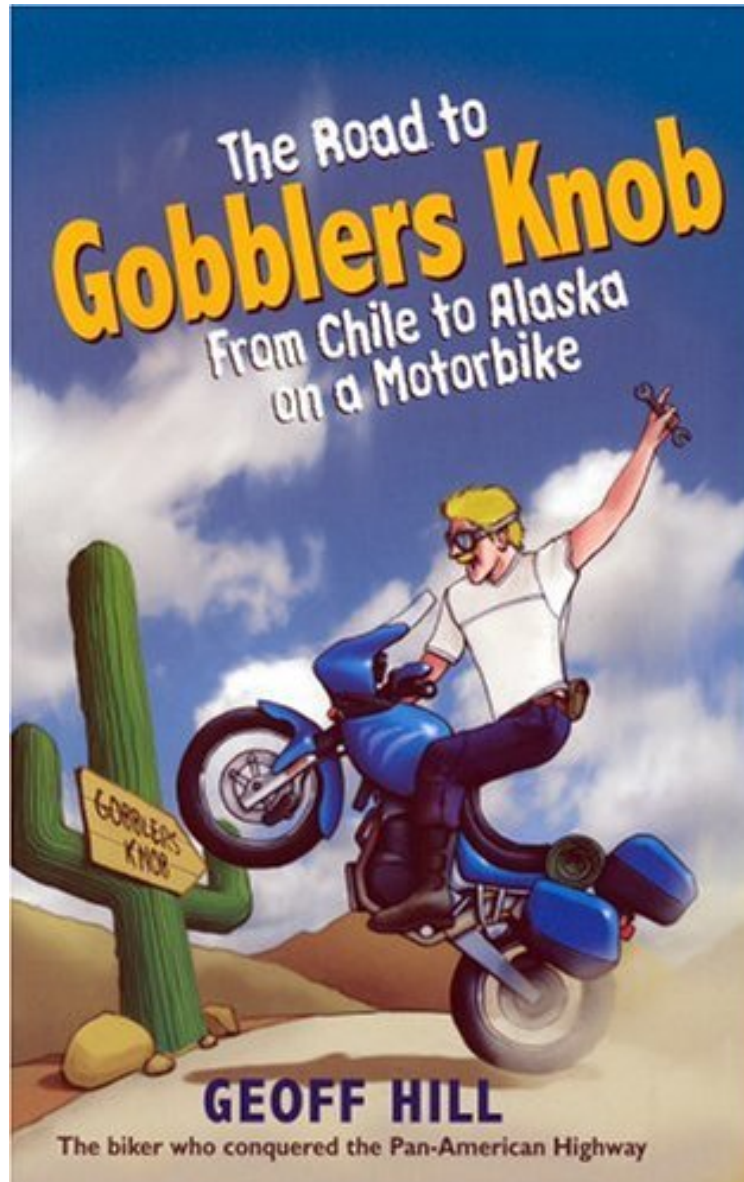

By Dean in KL This is not your average guy on a bike writing about his trip, Geoff Hill is a writer and a good one, so put that with a bike and the combination should add up. It does. If you like travelogues and particularly bike adventures this should be a good read for you. There is plenty of background given about the lives of the riders, so it's not an A to B account about waking, eating, getting fuel and riding. There's a fair bit of unplanned adventure, a hairy spill, and Geoff's companion in adventure is an Irish, ex. IoM racer, with a sense of humour to equal the balls you need to ride the Island as only the Irish can. Good book, good read.
