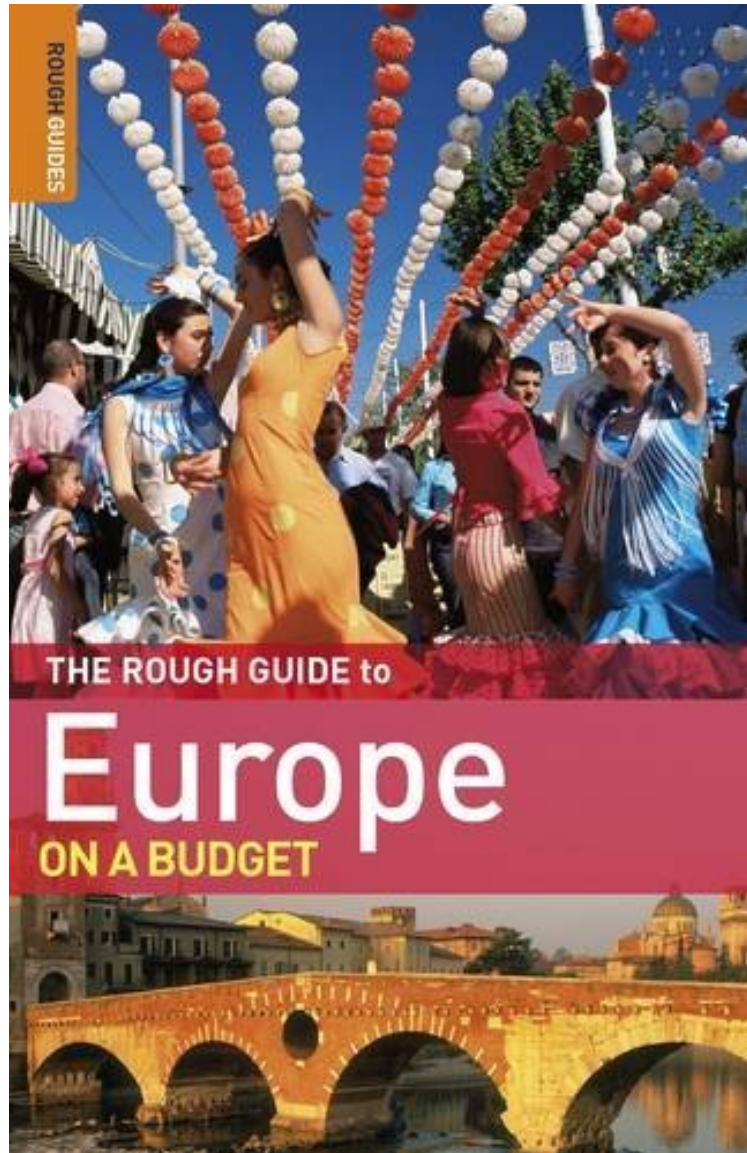

I was able to plan 33 days in Europe without airfare for \$2300. That includes hotels (not hostels or budget dorms, actually nice hotels), entrance fees to museums, EuroRail passes and budgeting in money for meals. and if you book 9 months in advance, we got airfare for \$650 a person round trip.
