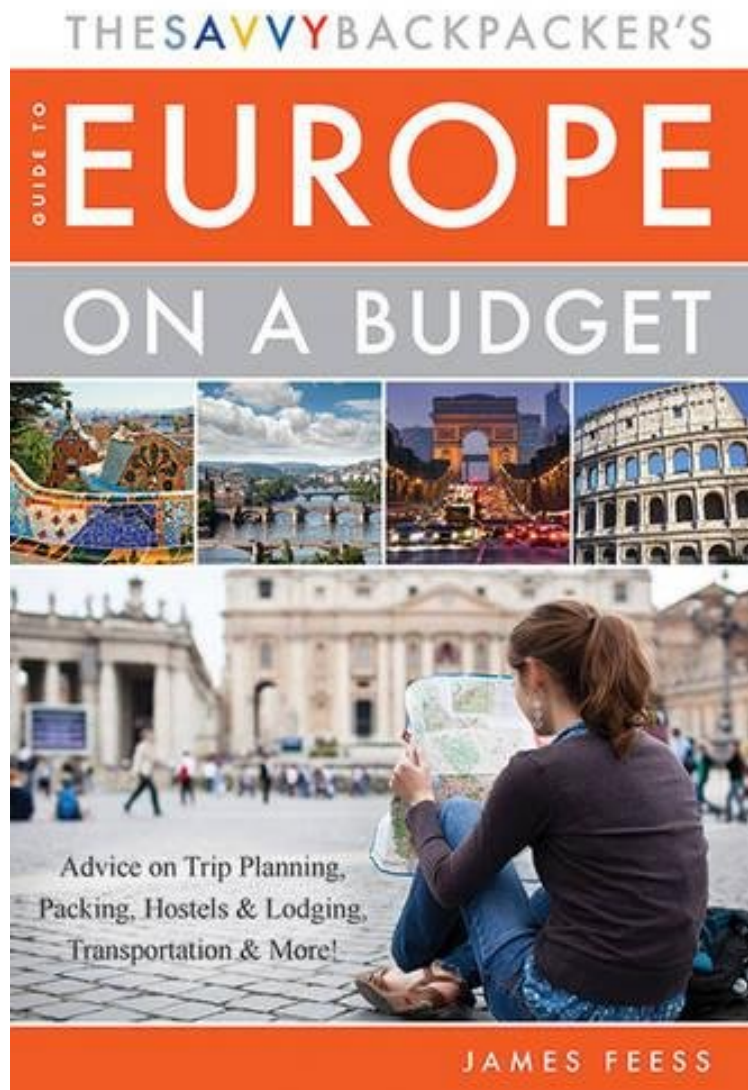

It has alleviated so much of my stress and it has made the whole planning process enjoyable. This book covers pretty much everything you need to know about planning a trip to Europe: hostels, using the trains/rail passes, budget airlines, solo travel, itinerary tips, packing lists, rental apartments, travel strategies, eating on the cheap, and a lot more. The book is written for people wanting to travel on a budget so there is a lot of advice about saving money. But the advice isn't exclusively focused on doing everything as cheaply as possible; it also talks about getting the maximum value for the money you spend (your time is more valuable than money). This book is great for budget-minded travelers in their 20s/30s but the advice is good for travelers of all ages. If you've already traveled to Europe a few times then you might already be familiar with a lot of the information in the book, but for new travelers the tips in this book will save you a lot of time and money. I highly recommend it. One final note: This book doesn't contain information about specific destinations (i.e. it won't tell you what to see/do/eat in London). It focuses on travel skills and planning advice. For destination-specific advice I recommend looking at guidebooks like Lonely Planet or Rick Steves.
